Personification assigns human qualities to non-human elements, creating vivid imagery and emotional connections, enhancing the reader's engagement with the text.

Anaphora involves repeating a word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses, creating rhythm and reinforcing the importance of the repeated idea.
