Explain what makes a sentence a "simple sentence."

A simple sentence is one that contains a single independent clause with a subject and a predicate, expressing a complete thought.

Describe the role of the subject and predicate in a simple sentence.

The subject is the main noun or pronoun that the sentence is about, while the predicate is the verb or verb phrase that tells something about the subject.

Why is it important for a simple sentence to express a complete thought?

Expresses a complete thought ensures clarity and understanding, allowing the sentence to stand alone without needing additional information.

The dog runs in the park.



Compare and contrast simple sentences with complex sentences.

Simple sentences contain one independent clause, while complex sentences include an independent clause and one or more dependent clauses.
