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What does BCBA stand for?

Board Certified Behavior Analyst

What is the primary focus of Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)?

To improve socially significant behaviors through the application of behavioral principles.

What is reinforcement in the context of ABA?

A consequence that increases the likelihood of a behavior being repeated.

What is the difference between positive and negative reinforcement?

Positive reinforcement involves adding a stimulus to increase a behavior, while negative reinforcement involves removing a stimulus to increase a behavior.

What is a functional behavior assessment (FBA)?

A process for identifying the purpose or function of a behavior in order to develop effective interventions.

What are the four functions of behavior?

Attention, escape, access to tangibles, and sensory stimulation.

What is the purpose of a behavior intervention plan ( BIP)?

To outline strategies and interventions to address challenging behaviors.

What is the difference between continuous and intermittent reinforcement schedules?

Continuous reinforcement provides reinforcement after every occurrence of a behavior, while intermittent reinforcement provides reinforcement after some occurrences.

What is shaping in ABA?

A technique used to teach new behaviors by reinforcing successive approximations toward the desired behavior.

What is the role of data collection in ABA?

To monitor progress, evaluate the effectiveness of interventions, and make data-driven decisions.
