- It tells you the author's name

Hint: Think about the context and other resources.

- Pictures
- Context of the sentence
- Dictionary definitions
- Author's background

- Check if it rhymes with another word
- Guess based on the story's theme

Hint: Think about a situation that makes you feel happy.

Which part of a story usually introduces the characters and setting?

Hint: Think about where the story begins.

- Conclusion
- Middle

What are some ways to identify the main idea of a passage?

Hint: Think about what stands out in the text.

- Look for repeated words or phrases
- Identify the first sentence
- Find the most interesting detail
- Summarize the passage in your own words

Hint: Consider how different settings create different feelings.
