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Part 1: Building a Foundation

What is the uppercase form of the letter "j"?

Hint: Think about the alphabet.

■ The uppercase form of the letter 'j' is 'J'.

Which of the following words start with the letter "J"? (Select all that apply)

Hint: Look for words that begin with the letter 'J'.

- Apple
- Jelly ✓
- Jacket ✓
- Banana

■ The words that start with 'J' are 'Jelly' and 'Jacket'.

Describe the sound that the letter "J" makes. Provide an example of a word that starts with this sound.

Hint: Think about how you pronounce 'J'.

The letter 'J' makes a sound like 'juh', as in 'jelly'.

List two objects that begin with the letter "J."

Hint: Think of items you can see around you.

1. Object 1

Jacket

2. Object 2

Juice

Examples of objects that begin with 'J' include 'Jacket' and 'Juice'.

Part 2: Understanding and Interpretation

Which of the following sentences contains a word that starts with the letter "J"?

Hint: Look for the letter 'J' in the sentences.

- The cat is sleeping.
- I like to eat apples.
- She wore a yellow jacket. ✓**
- He ran to the store.

The sentence that contains a word starting with 'J' is 'She wore a yellow jacket.'

Identify the correct phonetic sound for the letter "J" in these words. (Select all that apply)

Hint: Think about how 'J' sounds in different words.

- Juice ✓
- Jog ✓
- Cat
- Jump ✓

The words that have the correct phonetic sound for 'J' are 'Juice', 'Jog', and 'Jump'.

Explain why the word "jelly" is associated with the letter "J." What other words can you think of that have a similar beginning sound?

Hint: Consider the sound and spelling of 'jelly'.

The word 'jelly' starts with the letter 'J' and has the 'juh' sound. Other words include 'juice' and 'jacket'.

Part 3: Application and Analysis

If you were to organize a list of words in alphabetical order, where would "Jacket" appear relative to "Apple" and "Banana"?

Hint: Think about the order of letters in the alphabet.

- Before both ✓
- After both
- Between Apple and Banana
- At the end

The word 'Jacket' would appear before both 'Apple' and 'Banana'.

Imagine you are creating a story about a journey. Which of these words could you use to start your story with the letter "J"? (Select all that apply)

Hint: Think of words that relate to a journey.

- Journey ✓
- Jungle ✓
- Jump ✓
- Whisper

The words that could start a story about a journey are 'Jungle', 'Jump', and 'Journey'.

Create a short sentence using at least two words that start with the letter "J."

Hint: Think of a fun sentence with 'J' words.

An example sentence could be 'The joyful jaguar jumped.'

Which of the following pairs of words have a similar starting sound to "Jacket"?

Hint: Look for words that start with the same sound.

- Kite, Key
- Giraffe, Gym
- Jump, Joy ✓
- Cat, Dog

The pair of words that have a similar starting sound to 'Jacket' is 'Jump' and 'Joy'.

Analyze the following list and identify which words do not start with the same sound as "Jelly."
(Select all that apply)

Hint: Think about the sound of the letter 'J'.

- Giant
- Jam
- Giraffe ✓
- Jet

■ The words that do not start with the same sound as 'Jelly' are 'Giraffe'.

Analyze the word "Jigsaw." What makes it a suitable example for the letter "J"? Discuss its phonetic components.

Hint: Consider the sound and spelling of 'Jigsaw'.

■ The word 'Jigsaw' starts with 'J' and has the 'juh' sound. Its phonetic components include the 'J' sound followed by 'igsaw'.

Part 4: Evaluation and Creation

Evaluate the following scenario: If you were teaching someone the letter "J," which activity would be most effective?

Hint: Think about engaging activities for learning.

- Drawing pictures of objects that start with "J" ✓
- Reading a book with many "J" words
- Singing a song about the alphabet
- Writing the letter "J" repeatedly

■ The most effective activity would be drawing pictures of objects that start with 'J'.
