Part 2: Understanding and Interpretation

Which of the following sentences contains a word with a short "o" sound?

Hint: Listen for the sound in each sentence.

- She likes to read books.
- He flew a kite.

The sentence 'The dog ran to the pot.' contains a word with a short 'o' sound.

Identify the words that contain the letter "O" but do not start with it.

Hint: Look for words that have 'O' in the middle or end.

- Balloon ✓
- Orange
- Potato ✓
- Robot ✓

The words that contain 'O' but do not start with it are 'Balloon', 'Potato', and 'Robot'.
