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Part 1: Building a Foundation

What is the main function of the subject in a sentence?

Hint: Think about what the subject tells us in a sentence.

- To describe the action
- To tell who or what the sentence is about ✓**
- To provide additional information
- To join sentences together

■ The main function of the subject is to tell who or what the sentence is about.

Which of the following can be considered a simple subject?

Hint: Look for the main noun or pronoun in each option.

- The dog ✓**
- Ran quickly
- They ✓**
- Under the table

■ A simple subject is typically a noun or pronoun that tells who or what the sentence is about.

Define a predicate and explain its role in a sentence.

Hint: Consider what the predicate tells us about the subject.

A predicate tells what the subject does or is. It includes the verb and any objects or modifiers.

List two types of predicates and briefly describe each.

Hint: Think about the different ways predicates can be structured.

1. What is a simple predicate?

A simple predicate is the main verb or verb phrase in a sentence.

2. What is a compound predicate?

A compound predicate consists of two or more verbs that share the same subject.

Two types of predicates are simple predicates and compound predicates. A simple predicate consists of just the verb, while a compound predicate includes two or more verbs that share the same subject.

Part 2: Comprehension and Application

Which of the following sentences contains a compound subject?

Hint: Look for sentences with more than one subject.

- The cat and the dog are playing. ✓**
- She runs fast.
- The boy jumps.
- They were happy.

A compound subject consists of two or more subjects that share the same verb.

Identify the complete predicate in the sentence: "The teacher, who was very kind, gave us extra time."

Hint: Look for the verb and what follows it.

- The teacher
- Who was very kind
- Gave us extra time ✓**
- The teacher, who was very kind

The complete predicate includes the verb and all the words that tell what the subject does.

Explain how subject-predicate agreement affects sentence structure. Provide an example.

Hint: Consider how the subject and predicate must match in number.

Subject-predicate agreement ensures that the subject and verb match in number (singular or plural). For example, 'The dog barks' (singular) vs. 'The dogs bark' (plural).

Choose the sentence where the subject and predicate are correctly identified:

Hint: Look for the correct pairing of subject and predicate.

- The children (subject) / play in the park (predicate). ✓**
- Play in the park (subject) / the children (predicate).
- The children play (subject) / in the park (predicate).
- In the park (subject) / the children play (predicate).

The correct identification of subject and predicate is crucial for understanding sentence structure.

Write a sentence using a compound predicate and underline the predicates.

Hint: Think of actions that can be performed by the same subject.

A compound predicate includes two or more verbs that share the same subject. Example: 'The dog barks and runs.'

In the sentence "The quick brown fox jumps over the lazy dog," what is the simple subject?

The simple subject is the main noun that the sentence is about.

The subject is what the sentence is about, and the predicate tells what happened.

The subjects are 'The students and the teacher,' and the predicate is 'discuss the project after class.' The predicate describes what the subjects did.

Which sentence best demonstrates a complex sentence structure with a clear subject and predicate?

- The sun sets.
- Although it was late, the team continued to work. ✓**

A complex sentence contains an independent clause and at least one dependent clause.

A compound predicate consists of two or more verbs that share the same subject.
